- How to Engage your child in a conversation about school?
 - Ask open-ended questions If you ask a question that can be answered with one word yes or no that's what you will get. A one-word answer. Try asking open-ended questions instead.

"What was the best thing you did at school today?"

- Start with factual information - Students often have a hard time answering questions that seem to come out of the blue. Make an observation give your child something to relate to.

"I know you have a lot more students in your class this year. What's that like?"

- Share something about yourself - When someone tells you about themselves, it's natural to want to do that in return. Share something with your child and see what you get back.

"We always participated in intramurals at lunch when we were in school. What do you and your friends like to do at lunch?"



Avoid negative questions - If you think something isn't going well, your questions may come out in a negative way, with emotion-packed words like sad or mean. Asking in a positive way lets your child express concerns.

"I heard that you sat with new people at lunch today. What did you talk about?"

Instead of this	Try this
Was school fun today?	What was the best thing you did at school?
How was lunch?	Which kids were sitting near you at lunch?
Was your teacher nice?	What was the most interesting thing your teacher said today?
Did you get to your locker today at break?	How was it getting to your locker between classes?
Were the kids in your class friendly?	Who did you like talking to the most?
Do you have friends in your classes?	Who are the kids you talk to most in your classes?
Did your presentation go well?	What part of the presentation do you think was best?
